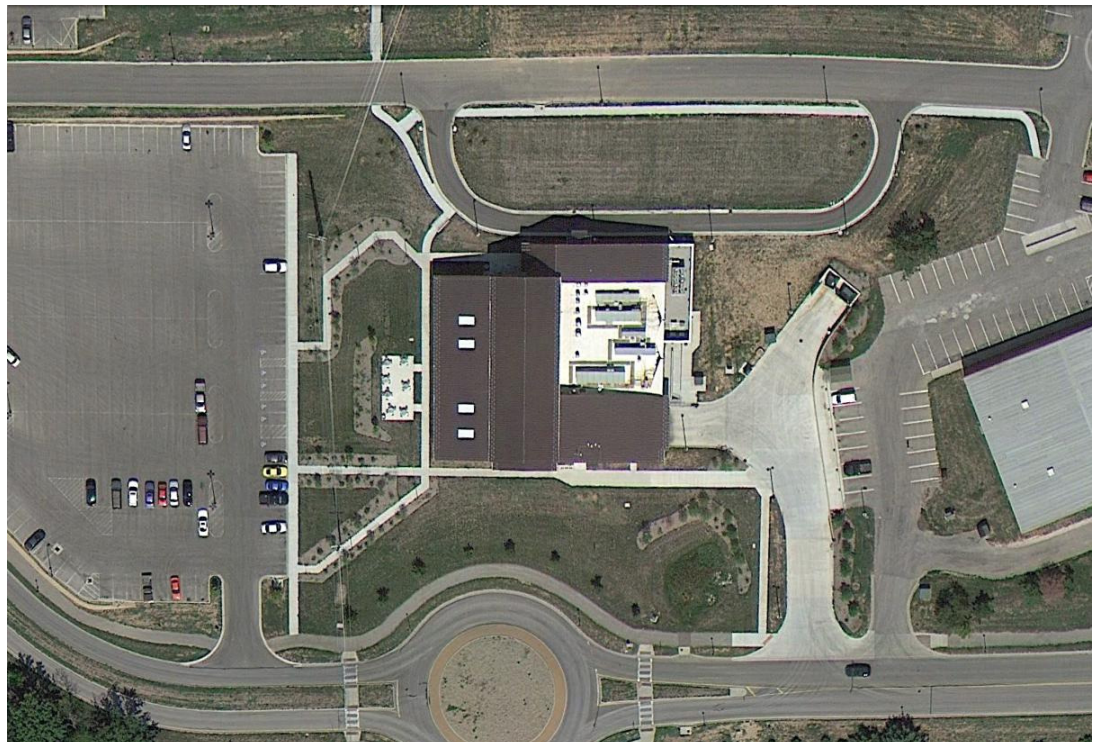

Giffels Webster was part of the team awarded a design/build dining hall contract by the U. S. Army Corp of Engineers. Three dining halls have completed to date: Ford Leonard, Fort Sill and Fort Leavenworth. Giffels Webster supplied civil engineering, surveying, and landscape architecture services for each. All have been designed to achieve LEED Silver rating.

The Fort Leavenworth dining hall project consisted of the construction of a new 17,757-square-foot dining facility and loading dock area to support the expansion of the adjacent Military Police Battalion barracks in Fort Leavenworth, Kansas. This 500-person per meal dining facility has 240 seats and was located with several other new facilities.

Coordination was necessary to ensure that all the facilities would come together to support the Military Police expansion. The civil engineering portion of project included site utilities (gas, water, sanitary sewer, and storm drainage), site grading, loading dock and ramp detailing, and coordination with adjacent projects.
